Report from the July 2012 CHNC Meeting

Tony from the SLC Police Dept. reported that the Memory Grove arsonist is now in custody. He set some fires last summer.

This year his arson attempt fortunately fizzled. Also reported was a recent spike in car thefts (67% increase) in our general area. The SW section of the avenues has been hit the hardest.

Joyce Valdez from the Mayor's office advised that a pilot glass recycling project will soon begin in some areas of the City with a \$6.00 per month charge.

The City Clean Air Challenge is beginning its month long competition. We were advised that the sprinklers in Warm Springs Park have been repaired

and that the fire danger is still very high.

The fire department reported that our Fire Station # 2 will be finished in a little more than two months. The Department is teaching CPR blitz classes. Public can register. Call 799fire for information. Also check slcfire.com for restricted fire areas.

Paul Hanks asked for the Council's support of his plan to renovate his deteriorating garage and extend it's size three feet west and three feet south and also to legalize in his home the lower level apartment, which has been there for about 40 years. The Council unanimously approved his request.

UDOT traffic operation's engineer for District 2, Robert Mills, stated that UDOT will do a speed and traffic study on Victory Road after school begins.

He also advised that there are no planned improvements for 5th North at this time.
