CLEANUP PILE INSTRUCTIONS:

The Neighborhood Cleanup Program is for BULKY WASTE ONLY. We will not remove any items or piles that are small enough to put into the appropriate recycle, yard waste or garbage container.

DO NOT BLOCK TRAFFIC, bike lanes, fire hydrants, storm drains, or sidewalks. Keep piles away from light poles, mailboxes, trees, or other fixed objects.

LARGE STUMPS AND LIMBS must be placed in a separate pile.
Small branches and green waste must be placed into your yard waste bins.

PLACE ALL RECYCLABLE ITEMS IN BLUE BINS

DONATE ALL REUSABLE ITEMS

WE WILL NOT REMOVE:

Commercial Construction waste.

Contractors are NOT ALLOWED to use this program.

WE WILL NOT REMOVE:

TIRES or HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE such as paints, oil, fluorescent lights, batteries, OLD ELECTRONICS, TVs, computer monitors, chemicals, and pesticides. For information on how to recycle these and other items, **please call 801-974-6920.**

WE WILL NOT REMOVE:

FLAMMABLE OR EXPLOSIVE MATERIAL such as aerosol cans, gas cans, propane tanks, etc... Call your local fire station for disposal info.
We will not remove REFRIGERATORS / FREEZERS unless tagged by a professional showing the Freon has been removed. Doors must be removed or firmly secured shut.

Heavy materials such as rock, sod, concrete and asphalt MUST NOT exceed two wheel barrels full!
