there is heavy pedestrian traffic crossing 500 North at this location. This traffic has two main two causes. First, there are many people who walk to Ensign Peak, the most popular recreation destination in Salt Lake City (see Trip Advisor). Second, many people park on the west side of East Capitol Blvd. while the state legislature is in session, often as far north as 700 North. These people must walk in the street to the Capitol and cross 500 North at the location of the proposed crosswalk.
